# CAREER GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING AND MIGRATION CHALLENGES: The point of view of international scholars

The second ESVDC webinar aims to pursue the critical, transnational, and comparative perspective that characterized its first edition, which addressed Next Generation EU. The ESVDC is more than ever trying to promote and advocate for a more human needs approach of career guidance and counseling. One of the most important contemporary and future challenge is inequality. Poverty and conflicts, linked with global/local relation to the world, lead to migration. This second seminar will then focus on how countries deal with migration challenges, from the point of view of vocational designing and career counseling.

International scholars from several countries (Australia, Brazil, France, Germany, Italy, Portugal, and Switzerland) will address the following questions:

- What are the main immigration issues faced in the country?
- What are the main **policies/debates** about immigration within the social context of the country?
- Who are the stakeholders who deal with these questions?
- To what extent does CGC contribute to these questions?
- How could CGC play a more important role in addressing migration challenges?

This second ESVDC webinar will take place online on **September 29, 2022, 3:00-6:00 pm** (CEST). The webinar will follow the ESVDC General Assembly (2:00pm-3:00pm) and will be introduced by a keynote from the recipient of the 2022 ESVDC Distinguishing Award.
